## ENTRANCE GATE

The next 3 gun event is scheduled for September 20th, depending on weather and range conditions. – Dick Edder

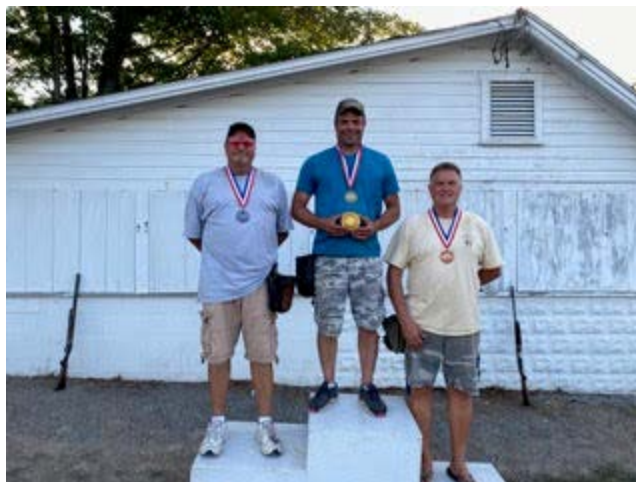
### **SKEET**

**SPORTING CLAYS**

Our new Sporting Clay course is open! The new course is now a registered NSCA course. It has 4 new stations, more open shooting lanes, new drainage, improved roads, improved station pads, and 10 new traps with a variety of target presentations.

Because of the limited number of golf carts, please only use 1 cart per squad and always 4 shooters per cart. Also, remember to pick up your hulls and trash.

To all shooters using the sporting clays course. Our course requires workers during the week, during shooting hours to perform maintenance. If you get to the course and the workers are in the field, **Shooters Must Always** unload and yield to the workers filling or repairing the traps or cutting grass in the field area. All guns must be unloaded, and muzzles pointed in a safe direction, away from the workers. Never push the pull cord buttons that release the targets until the worker has left the field area. (this goes for the whole course, i.e. you can't shoot station 2 if the workers are on station 4). If stations are not working, it might be that the workers have it disconnected while work is under way. **NEVER** reconnect a machine that has been disconnected for repair or maintenance. This work is

necessary to keep the course in working order, so PLEASE keep the safety of everyone in mind.

Clays Committee is notifying all members and especially those who are approved to open and close the following: Kindly understand our club is managed by you alone and by other volunteers so please step up and lend a helping hand from time to time.

This is how you can help!

All Skeet / Trap Fields are now managed and maintained by the appointed "Clays Committee member's" and all members who decide they can help too. Everyone's support is appreciated.

So please help the committee when you are at the club. Pitch in when you can is all we are asking. This is a good starting point for us to follow.

1. When you turn on Traps.If you are capable: Carry Targets up the steps inside the high houses and stack beside the trap.

If you are capable: Take a box of targets from storage to the bench beside the low house trap

Pick up the broom and sweep the floor to the front door and dust plan the mess into the trash can.

Sweep broken targets from Pad 1 and Pad 7 off the pads

2. When you load the Traps.

Take the empty boxes to the burn box south of the elite field.

3. If you are shooting a Semi-automatic or eject shells onto the ground

**Pick up your shells!**

4. Everyone remind fellow members to follow these 3 simple rules.

**Please Note: It is the responsibility for all shooters to pick up their empty hulls when your shooting session is finished. If everyone does this, the ranges will remain neat and clean.**

**This note applies to the pistol and rifle range as well. We have noticed a large amount of brass and steel casing left in the grass at both ranges. It doesn't take much effort to bend over and pick up after shooting. There is a magnetic stick at the rifle range to aid in picking up steel casings.**
